## I. INTRODUCTION

- The aim of this document is to provide you with:
  - **General Information** about the structure of postsecondary education in Ontario, information on accommodation on and off-campuses, what to expect when you arrive in Ontario, and so on.
  - **Information on each partner institution in Ontario.** This is general information on each Ontario partner institution and provides the email addresses of international offices as well as information on requirements each institution has of OIN students.
- Please contact the international office at your home institution if you require further information.
- You should contact the persons listed in individual entries only when you have been placed at a partner institution by OIN and have heard from them accepting the placement.
- If you have been informed of your placement and have not heard from the host institution by June, please contact us at: [Sukeshi.kamra@carleton.ca](mailto:Sukeshi.kamra@carleton.ca).
- OIN will place you for one or two semesters, depending on availability of spaces at Ontario partner institutions. The acceptance letter will indicate: (i) at which institution OIN has placed you; (ii) and for how long: whether it is one or two terms. **It is important to remember that you cannot change the terms of agreement spelled out in the letter without first discussing it with your university's international office and OIN.** Example: if you have been placed at an Ontario university for ONE term only and would prefer to add another term, you must contact your international office and have them discuss the issue with OIN. A word of caution: if you have been placed for a term it is highly unlikely that a request for another term can be accommodated.

## II. GENERAL INFORMATION

- All undergraduate degrees in Ontario are of four years duration. This means that if you have completed three years at an Indian institution you are eligible to apply to take fourth-year courses at an Ontario institution, providing you have the required background in the subject area. The **undergraduate calendar** of an Ontario university (posted on websites of the institutions) will give you information about: (i) degrees, and programs within degrees; (ii) courses—which have a sequential numbering, with first year courses starting with the number 1 (example: ENGL 1000), second year with the number 2 (example: ENGL 2002), third year with the number 3 (example: ENGL 3100), and fourth year with the number 4 (example: ENGL 4900); (iii) and course descriptions (short blurbs on the focus of courses). For more detailed information on courses you can check a departmental website, where the 'course outline' (the equivalent of the Indian university syllabus) of courses taught in the current year can be accessed. Each outline will provide a list of required texts, assignments, the schedule of lectures/seminars, and so on. Please make sure you are familiar with the policy on academic integrity, on accommodations, and other rules on in-class tests and examinations.
- Making sure you have the background to take courses at the host institution will make the process of getting approval from the host institution much simpler. Advice: present the host institution with course outlines (your 'syllabus') which they can then forward to academic departments to establish your knowledge of the discipline in which you wish to take courses at the Ontario host institution.
- Your status as an exchange student in Ontario is 'non-degree'. The term indicates, to the Registrar's Office, that you are not a regular university student enrolled in a degree program offered at the Ontario university. In other words, you cannot earn a degree while participating in the exchange. If you wish to change from non-degree to degree status, you will have to apply to be admitted as a regular student, pay full foreign student tuition fees, and will be withdrawn from the OIN program.
- The International Office of the host institution will send your **transcript** to the International Office of your home institution electronically. Print copies have ended up not reaching Indian students at the Indian address provided by them. Thus the decision has been taken to send electronic copies only. Please contact your home institution's International Office for the transcript. The OIN office will send you a

**certificate of completion** of the exchange program, also electronically.

- The Academic Year in all Ontario universities is from September to May. The academic year is divided into the Fall Term (September to December) and the Winter Term (January to May). When you are admitted to the OIN exchange, you confirm your intention to study for one or more terms: Fall or Winter.

### III. CAMPUS INFORMATION, ACCOMMODATION

- Ontario universities usually reserve spaces in their hostels for exchange students. Information on hostels can be found under individual listings. Off-campus housing: usually, off-campus housing rental information is posted on university websites and posted on information boards on campus. Most off-campus rentals (especially apartments in apartment buildings) will require you to sign a lease and it may be difficult to locate accommodation off-campus for a short period (four months counts as a short period). You could look for advertisements for shared accommodation with other students and also for listings for rooms or basement suites in homes as many home-owners with houses close to campus rent rooms and suites to students.
- In a majority of Ontario universities exchange students are required to pay student fees. As such, exchange students can avail themselves of facilities open to students (including the gymnasium).
- Depending on the type of visa you have, you may be able to apply for on-campus jobs.

### IV. TRAVELLING TO CANADA AND ARRIVAL INFORMATION

- You need a Canadian visa if you have an Indian passport. Please check the following website for information: <http://www.vfsglobal.ca/canada/india/>
- It is advisable to have an internationally valid credit card with you as well as to have some cash on hand. Travelers cheques, in dollars, is also an option. The State Bank of India has a branch in Toronto.
- The two airports in Ontario where most OIN exchange students arrive are Toronto and Ottawa. You will need to make your own way to your destination (see next bullet about attending the OUI orientation which takes place prior to the start of the Fall term). So please make sure you are aware of taxi fare, public transportation to downtown Toronto or Ottawa, and/or make your way to the Information booth at the airport.
- **IMPORTANT:** OUI has an orientation for exchange students of the four programs (China, France, Germany, and India) every year, usually in the third week of August. The two-day orientation is held at the Glendon College campus of York University in Toronto. The OUI office sends information to exchange students about the orientation (which has a modest fee of around \$100.00 Canadian) some time prior to the date. - Exchange students are strongly encouraged to attend the orientation. Not only does the orientation provide a context within which to meet other Indian students on exchange but students from these other countries. There are social activities that take place as well and a session with the OIN director where much information is disseminated and attempts at resolving issues faced by incoming exchange students can be made.

## V. INFORMATION ON ONTARIO PARTNER INSTITUTIONS

This booklet provides brief information about the individual Ontario universities that participate in the OIN program. Please consult the home page and other websites recommended by each individual university for updated information.

In using the individual university listings, please note the following:

- In Canada “Undergraduates” or “Undergraduate Students” are students studying for a Bachelor degree; “Graduate Students” are enrolled for Masters or PhD degrees. The term “Postgraduate Student” is not commonly used in Canada.
- In Canada, a Program refers to studies towards a specific degree or diploma, i.e. ‘the B.A. program in Geography’. Each student attends lectures in specific “Courses”, i.e. SS1020 Introduction to Psychology”.
- ESL refers to ‘English as a Second Language’. This usually refers to special help and lessons for those students who need help with English.
- UHIP is the acronym for the University Health Insurance Plan, which is mandatory for all Indian students on the OIN program (the University of Windsor has its own required health insurance plan that replaces UHIP). In 2016-2017, it costs \$51.00 per month.
- A meal plan is a pre-paid plan through which students pay for meals at cafeterias and restaurants, and in some cases for food and supplies in grocery stores.
- TOEFL: Test of English as a Foreign Language
- MELAB: Michigan English Language Assessment Battery
- CPE: Cambridge English Proficiency
- IELTS: International English Language Testing System
- CAEL: Canadian Academic English Language
- Most universities run on the semester system, with the Fall semester starting in September and the Winter semester in January.

*Language Competence* Students can demonstrate their English language proficiency by presenting official transcripts to indicate that they have studied for the last three years (full-time) in a high school, college or university in a country in which one of the primary languages is English and where the language of instruction in the relevant educational institution was exclusively English.

Documents should be **original**, with issuing dates **no more than 24 months** from the time of application, and should be officially **in English**.

Students are responsible for securing their own accommodations. Visit the off-campus housing website offered by the Department of Housing to access listings and other resources. It is suggested to arrive 2-3 weeks prior to the start of the term, should finances allow you to do so. Students should start making appointments to see the off-campus listings that are of interest and book temporary accommodations to allow them to perform searches in person. Many lease and rental agreements start on the 1st of the month and the longer you wait, the less you will have to choose from. We are not able to assist in the search for off-campus accommodations.

## Carleton University (Ottawa)

*Academic Notes* **Undergraduate** exchange students are required to be enrolled in full-time studies (minimum 1.5 credits- maximum of 2.5 credits per term). The regular course load is 2.0 credits per term. Exchange students must consult with their home institution to confirm the required courses for enrollment in full-time studies. Information on your course registration will be emailed to the Carleton email account for undergraduate students from the Registrar's Office. Included in that email will be detailed instructions on how to make registration changes.

**Language courses:** If you have requested a language course and have previous knowledge of that language, you must complete a placement test to confirm your level of proficiency. If it is determined that you have a higher level of proficiency, you will be required to withdraw from the course. Your placement test would be completed in the main office of the [School of Linguistics and Language Studies \(SLaLS\)](#). For information on the testing schedules, please consult the [placement testing page](#) available or call +1 (613) 520-6612. Following the test, an email will be sent to your Carleton email account indicating your language placement. At this point you will be able to register in the course level indicated (space permitting). You should attempt to take the placement test as soon as you arrive in Canada as space in language courses is limited. Although testing for Carleton students is expected to be completed prior to the start of classes, testing after classes have started is permitted for exchange students. **Testing for the Fall term is not available after the end of the first week of classes.** For Winter term language courses, testing will begin again in October and continue until December.

*Academic Notes* **Graduate** exchange students are required to be enrolled in Carleton University's equivalent of graduate level full-time studies (typically 0.5 credit to 1.5 credit at the graduate level) and will be registered by the Faculty of Graduate and Postdoctoral Affairs. Information on your course registration will be emailed to the Carleton email account and will include instructions on how to make registration changes.

<i>Language Competence</i>	No formal test is required and institutional evaluations and letters of recommendation are accepted. ESL help is available for undergraduate students free of charge.
<i>Student Activity Fees</i>	Required: UHIP (\$51/ month) + compulsory ancillary fess including one time charges for bus pass (\$177) and ID card (\$4.25). NOTE: Fees subject to slight increases from year to year
<i>University Exchange Application Deadlines</i>	Fall: May 30th Winter: October 15
<i>Residence</i>	Each student has a private bedroom in residence and shares a kitchen, living room and bathroom with 4-6 other students. Residence cost range between \$2800.00 to \$3,140.00 per semester (depending on residence). Students will be financially responsible for any damages incurred. The residence application deadline is July 1 <sup>st</sup> for the 1 <sup>st</sup> semester and December 1 <sup>st</sup> for the 2 <sup>nd</sup> semester. There is no mandatory meal plan. Temporary accommodation before classes start in August can be arranged according to student's need, but must be requested 1 month prior to arrival. Costs depend on the circumstances. Residence applications are completed online after the student is accepted to study on exchange.

*Language Competence* Most courses at the University of Ottawa are offered in English and French. **OMG students must submit a language proficiency test at the time of application if they wish to take courses offered in French.**

Please note that proficiency tests administered by home institutions **are NOT accepted**. Language requirements can be found under *Ensure language proficiency* at following link: <http://international.uottawa.ca/en/study-at-uottawa/incoming-exchanges-applications/step1-where-start#ensure>

*Student Activity Fees & Medical Insurance* Exchange students have “special student” status at uOttawa. They are exempted from paying tuition and incidental fees. However, students may have to pay supplemental fees in courses (learning materials, laboratory fees, field trips. etc.).

**Subscription to the University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP) is compulsory for all international exchange students.** No exception will be made even if students have subscribed to a complementary health insurance policy prior to leaving their country of origin.

The premiums are:  
 \$204 CAD for 4 months  
 \$408 CAD for 8 months

*University Exchange Application Deadline* **March 31:** annual deadline for the Fall session **and** the Winter session

*Residence* On-campus housing in university residences is available for exchange students, but it is not guaranteed as space is very limited. A request for a room in residence can be made once an exchange student is registered to courses. Details are available in our student guide. Please note that a room in a University residence costs approximately \$800 per month while the price for off-campus housing varies from \$450 to \$800 per month.

**If you are not assigned a room in a university residence**, you will be responsible for finding off-campus accommodation. Former exchange students have easily found off-campus housing in Ottawa in a safe environment and close to campus by:

The Off-Campus Housing Service will help you find off-campus housing. There are several types of off-campus housing options close to the University, including sharing an apartment in an apartment complex or renting a room in a private house with roommates. The Off-Campus Housing Service provides lists of available housing options and links to the main newspapers in the Ottawa region.

*Financial Aid* Students do not receive funding from uOttawa. If students come for the academic year and have a study permit, they can apply for the Work-Study program, which gives them access to jobs on campus.

*General Notes* Some programs are only offered in French.

*Restrictions on Disciplines* Telfer School of Management, Faculty of Education and Faculty of Medicine courses/programs **are not open** to undergraduate exchange students.

## University of Ottawa (Ottawa)

Law: Students must be registered in a Law program at their home university and have an academic background in Law. Space is limited and each file is evaluated individually. Civil Law (droit civil) is only offered in French.

Engineering and Science: very strict with students' academic standing and course prerequisites.

*Academic Notes* Students may only enrol in graduate courses if they are registered as graduate students in their chosen field of study at their home institution.

*Restrictions on Disciplines* Telfer School of Management and Faculty of Medicine courses/programs **are not open** to graduate exchange students.

*Academic Notes* Students who wish to register in graduate courses must have a university degree equivalent to a Canadian Honours' degree and be registered as graduate students in their chosen field of study.

Graduate level exchange students must have the average required for admission to their program of interest at uOttawa. The minimum average is normally B+ (75% or equivalent) or higher.

<i>Language Competence</i>	Minimum English proficiency results are the same as the requirements for our <a href="#">undergraduate admissions</a> . Please see 'Alternate Tests' section of the webpage for specific score for TOEFL, MELAB, IELTS, CAEL and PTE. We use these results as <i>guidelines</i> for assessing incoming exchange students.
<i>Student Activity Fees</i>	Required: UHIP (\$204/ term, subject to change). Some courses involve additional fees.
<i>University Exchange Application Deadlines</i>	Fall – April 1 <sup>st</sup> Winter – October 1 <sup>st</sup>
<i>Residence</i>	<b>Finding accommodations is the responsibility of the exchange student.</b> Students staying for the Fall & Winter semesters or only the Winter semester may apply to the <a href="#">on-campus residences</a> . However, please note there <i>are many more applicants than spaces available</i> . The application deadline is in early June.  There are also several non-Ryerson-affiliated residences near campus, as well as many private apartments for rent. Students should search and apply for housing well in advance of their arrival in Toronto to ensure they find convenient and affordable accommodations as the <i>housing market is very competitive</i> , especially in the Fall. There is no temporary accommodation via Ryerson available in August before classes start.
<i>Financial Aid</i>	Financial Aid is not available to exchange students. Exchange students are occasionally allowed to work on campus, but should not rely on this possibility for their living expenses.

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<i>Number of Spaces</i>	2-3 students
<i>Restrictions on Disciplines</i>	Difficult to place students in highly competitive programs such as FCAD (Image Arts, Journalism, Radio & Television Arts, Fashion). Ryerson Theatre School and English Department are not open to exchange students. All applicants will be handled on a case-by-case basis and require approval from the academic program.
<i>Academic Notes</i>	Students <b>must select a <a href="#">Ryerson undergraduate program</a> and choose courses offered through that program</b> when completing the OMG application form. Exchange students are required to take a minimum of 4 courses and a maximum of 6 courses. When preparing a study plan, students should choose 8-10 courses per semester to allow for flexibility during the enrollment process, as course conflicts may arise, some courses may fill up quickly or some courses may not be offered every semester.

Graduates: You must submit evidence of proficiency in English, such as a minimum TOEFL score of 213 (electronic version) or 550 (pencil and paper version). IELTS minimum of 6.0.
